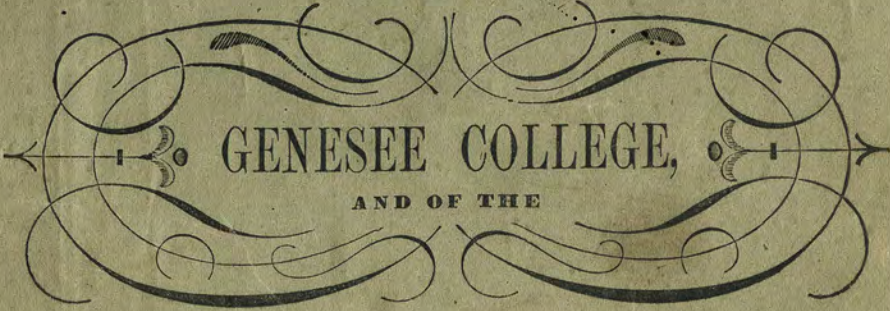

General Remarks.

I. It will be seen, by an examination of the foregoing pages, that the course of study in Genesee College is more extensive and more methodical, than in any similar institution in the country; for, though the amount of Greek and Latin is a little less, the range of physical and moral sciences is far greater, than is common in American Colleges and Universities. As man is a three-fold being in respect to the faculties of his nature, so it is found upon thorough examination, the world without him, as an object of study, is divided exactly in the same manner. Knowledge, as well as man, is either physical, intellectual or moral, as we look upon the outward world in its relations respectively to the body, intellect and soul. For every faculty, there is a corresponding science, or department of science, in the Universe about us; and, therefore, to draw out and mature ALL the faculties of our being, which is the true theory of what is called education, we have only to embrace in our system of instruction the entire circle of the sciences, and to arrange and apply them in such a manner as to meet every want of our complex nature. The entire physical man, for example, is provided for by the study of Anatomy and Physiology, and the remaining branches under the head of Physics; the mental part is reached by those studies ranged under the department of Intellectual Education, which, following Bacon's subdivision of the intellect into *memory*, *reason* and *imagination*, gives us the *corresponding* disciplines arising from the *historical*, the *ratiocinative* and the *ornamental* and *belles-lettres* branches; while the moral part of man, including his relations to the present and future worlds, is to be developed by pursuing those studies, which are placed in the third grand division of our scheme.

II. In this way, it is the intention to attempt a complete, as well as a thorough and definite education of those, who shall be submitted to our hands. We are as anxious to make every one of them a pattern of what a man should be, physically and morally, as we are to give them intellectual culture, which is about all that is aimed at in the various Colleges and Universities of modern times. It is our belief, that in the case of those having the time and the means, a full development of every faculty ought to be reasonably attained.

before any particular faculty, or set of faculties, should be specially educated, as is done in the acquirement of a profession, or a trade.

III. After this general education is completed, our plan provides for the specific or professional education of our pupils. In a short time, we expect to have the several liberal professions, mentioned in our course of study, amply provided for, by the erection of so many separate schools; but, until that end is reached, we propose to open, as we have demand, courses of lectures on these professions, by which our students can make a good beginning in the callings to which they may respectively devote their lives. These lectures will also furnish to all our students those general views of the several professions, which every liberally-educated gentleman is supposed to have acquired.

IV. That our pupils may be better prepared for the whole of this extended course, we have opened a Preparatory School, on the premises of the College, where lads can begin their education at a very early period of their life, and in conformity and harmony with our plan. Those, therefore, who wish to take advantage of our entire course, will begin with the Preparatory School, then advance to those classes of the Genesee Wesleyan Seminary, which prepare them for entrance into College, and then, after spending four years as undergraduates, they go into one of the Professional Schools, which are ultimately to be erected.

V. Those, on the other hand, who wish to take a less extended course, may pursue any portion of this scheme, that their time of life and pecuniary circumstances may make desirable. The pupil may be sent to the Preparatory School, to the Seminary, to the College, or to either of the Professional Institutions, at any time, and for any period, which the parent or the student may think advisable; and such is the variety of institutions located in immediate connection with each other, that the public can hardly fail to find, under any circumstances, what may be wanted in any given case.

VI. It will be observed, that the Course of Reading for undergraduates is not obligatory upon them; but we propose that those who have opportunity for the perusal of books should have the advantage of a thorough and subsidiary plan of reading, on all the studies pursued by them, rather than spend their time in pursuing at hap-hazard, such works, good or bad, as may happen to fall into their hands.

VII. The expenses of our pupils are about the same as those published for the students of the Seminary, there being only the difference of tuition and a small charge for incidentals; while the tuition itself is, in each Institution, but the interest of one hundred dollars, after this sum has been paid into the treasury on the receipt of a perpetual scholarship, which is sold for this amount.

VIII. The government of Genesee College is parental. Each pupil is regarded as a member of a Christian family; and he is expected to make his conduct consistent with the ordinary principles and rules of a virtuous household. He is to be, in a word, a gentleman; and whenever his behavior ceases to correspond to this character, he will be admonished, reprov'd, but borne with while there is reasonable hope of reformation. When this hope is gone, he will be dismissed from the Institution, either privately or publicly, according to the nature of his offense. We shall never allow persons of bad or doubtful reputation to remain among us, to corrupt the morals of their fellow-students, and pervert the good order of the Institution.

IX. As the College is young, it opens with the conviction that it has to make its reputation, and that this is to be done by making fine scholars, and maintaining the most perfect discipline.

X. TERMS AND VACATIONS.—First Term begins on the last Thursday of August, and continues thirteen weeks. Second Term begins on the second Thursday of December, and continues thirteen weeks. Third Term begins on the last Thursday of March, and continues fourteen weeks.

XI. Tuition, (not on scholarship,) \$8.50 per term; on scholarship, free. All letters pertaining to the College, excepting on pecuniary questions, to be addressed to the President. Letters in regard to the Treasury, to be addressed to the Treasurer at Lima. Letters in relation to boarding, to be addressed to David Hale, Esq., Lima.

XII. Lectures on Chemistry, Anatomy, Physiology, and Natural Philosophy, are given to the students at one dollar per term, extra charge.

XIII. There is a literary Society of the students, in a very flourishing condition, which employs from ten to twelve of our most distinguished men, from all parts of the country, in a course of annual public lectures. This Society is rapidly forming a Library, and by means of its lectures, is associating with itself some of the best talent of the nation.

General Remarks.

It will be perceived by examining the foregoing course of study, that the instruction given in the Genesee Wesleyan Seminary, is divided into three parts :

I. The General Department of the Institution embraces all those studies, which are supposed to be most valuable to all persons, in all the ordinary relations and exigencies of life ; and to those ladies and gentlemen, who complete the course, a diploma is awarded, that certifies the fact of their graduation through it.

II. The School Teachers' Department is designed to fit young gentlemen and ladies expressly and rapidly, as well as thoroughly, for the work of teaching Common and other Schools. It is under the general supervision of a single Professor, who is to have, and now has, all the facilities and help requisite to a thorough accomplishment of this important object. Its labors are performed by recitations and lectures on all the topics, theoretical and practical, necessary to a mastery of this profession. The Department has hitherto been abundantly successful, it having sent into the world more school teachers, probably, than any other Institution in this country. About two hundred have been connected with it during the past year.

III. The Preparatory Department has been recently organized for the express benefit of those, who send their sons and daughters to us before they reach an age suitable to an entrance into the higher labors and operations of the Institution. The pupils sit six hours per day in the presence of their teachers, and are made to pursue and master those lower branches of study, such as reading, spelling, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, &c., &c., which are absolutely fundamental to accomplished education, though too generally neglected in our seminaries of learning.

Apparatus.

The Apparatus of the Institution has been recently considerably enlarged and is now abundantly ample for all the purposes of academical and general instruction.

Cabinet.

The Cabinet of mineralogical and geological specimens embraces an ample collection of rocks, soils, &c., &c., including a full suit received from the State, and is deemed quite equal to the wants of students pursuing these branches.

Terms and Vacations.

First Term begins on the last Thursday of August, and continues thirteen weeks. Second Term begins on the second Thursday of December, and continues thirteen weeks. Third Term begins on the last Thursday of March, and continues fourteen weeks.

Literary Societies.

AMPHICTYON, GENESEE LYCEUM, LADIES' LITERARY SOCIETY.—They have each a Library and an appropriately furnished room.

Connected with the Amphictyon Association, and Genesee Lyceum, are Reading Rooms, furnished with various Journals and Reviews, accessible to the Students by the payment of a small fee each term.

Seminary Library.

Students can have access to the Library by paying a small sum per term to Prof. HOYT, Librarian.

Note to Parents and Guardians.

It is earnestly advised that all money for the use of such students as are minors, be deposited with some one of the officers of the Seminary; and that no expenditure be allowed except under the direction of such officer. Parents who understand the importance of this advice will not neglect it.

Merit Roll.

A regular account of the daily recitations will be kept by each teacher, exhibiting the standing and scholarship of each student during the term.

Students furnish their own lights, pails, wash-bowls, towels and mirrors. During the Fall and Winter Terms, the Ladies will be charged \$1,25 per term for sawing and carrying wood to their rooms.

Tuition will be charged from the time of entrance to the close of the term; and no deduction will be made, except in cases of previous agreement, or of continued sickness. No deduction is made for those who enter within two weeks of the commencement of the term.

The Boarding Hall is under the direction of the Steward who is employed by the Trustees, and has no pecuniary interest in the profits and losses of the establishment.

Parents may therefore rest assured that good board will be furnished for their children, and that every necessary attention will be given them in case of sickness.

Communications on the subject of board, &c., post-paid addressed to the Steward, will receive prompt attention. On other matters they may be addressed to the Principal.

Payment for Board and Tuition must be made quarterly, in advance. But in case a student is obliged to leave the Institution on account of sickness, his money will be refunded.

None will be considered members of the Institution until they have called on Prof. HOYT and registered their names and place of residence.

Damages to the building and furniture are charged to those who commit them, or to the occupant of the room.

Students who board in the Institution are expected to continue to the close of the term, if they remain members of the school; and accordingly are held accountable for board and room-rent for that time.



By-Laws.

1. The students shall arise in the morning at the ringing of the bell, sweep and arrange their rooms, and at the toll of the bell shall assemble for prayers in the chapel. The same signal shall assemble them for evening prayers.
2. No student shall be unnecessarily absent from his room, leave the Seminary yard, or visit the room of a fellow student, during the hours of study, without permission or order from one of the officers.
3. The student shall punctually perform every duty enjoined by the officers, diligently employ the hours of study, and, on being notified by the bell, or otherwise, to attend recitation, lecture, or other exercises, shall repair without delay to the rooms appointed.
4. There shall be annually a public examination and exhibition, which every student shall attend.
5. As a precaution against fire, every student shall have his pail filled with water before retiring for the night.
6. During the hours of recess, no student shall indulge in hallooing, loud talking, running, jumping, whistling, or making other disturbances in the rooms or halls of the Seminary.
7. No student shall, in any way, injure the Seminary building, or anything connected with the Institution.
8. No student shall throw ashes, dirt or other filthy materials, from the windows of the building.
9. All students are required to cherish a respectful deference for the authority of the Faculty; and in all their social intercourse and relations to preserve a correct and becoming deportment.
10. Any student refusing to give information in reference to another student when required by the Faculty, shall be liable to such punishment as they may judge proper.
11. Playing at games of chance, in the Seminary or elsewhere, is totally forbidden.
12. Cleanliness of person and neatness of apparel are ever to be observed.

13. No student shall leave town, or absent himself from his room over night, or go abroad to spend the Sabbath with his friends or others, without special permission.

14. No student shall go into the kitchen or bake-room, except he be in the immediate employ of the steward; nor shall he go into the wash-room, except at stated times, to convey and receive his clothing.

15. At the ringing of the bell for meals, those students boarding in the Institution shall assemble without confusion or disorder, in the dining hall, and take such seats as are assigned them, which they shall occupy until a change be directed.

16. No student shall speak, make a noise, or meddle with any article upon the table, until the religious services of the table are performed. Perfect propriety and decorum must be observed by every student, while at the table. No one shall retire until the table is duly dismissed, after which the students shall leave the room in good order.

17. No student shall visit taverns, groceries, or other public places for purposes of pleasure or entertainment—nor use spirituous liquors or tobacco, in any form in the Seminary buildings—nor employ immodest or profane language of any description.

18. A strict observance of the Christian Sabbath will be required of all the students, and on no account will unnecessary noise be allowed—nor may students on that day go abroad into the fields, or frequent the village, or collect at each others' rooms without express permission. Sobriety and decorum must be maintained throughout the day, and attendance at church in the morning and afternoon, at such place as their parents or guardians may require, will be expected of all the students.

19. The faculty may have access, at all times, to the rooms of the students.

20. No student shall make any fire in his stove after half past nine o'clock in the evening, and every one shall retire by ten.

Female Department.

1. No male student is permitted to visit or enter that part of the building assigned exclusively to the females, except those in the immediate employment of the steward.

2. If any male student has a relative in the female department whom he wishes to see, he will be permitted to go to the steward's room, request her to be sent for, and there converse with her.

3. Female students shall be under the same restrictions as the males, with regard to the above regulations. In case of confinement by sickness, however permission is given to visit each other at their rooms.
