Our Purpose ... “We Remember”

In 1990, the Syracuse University first established the Pan Am Flight 103 Archive to bring together in one place the stories, materials, and photos of all 270 people lost in the Pan Am Flight 103 disaster. The archive provides a place to personalize their lives, a place where their families can donate materials by or about them to let future generations know in some way what has been lost by their deaths.

The Archive is here to preserve the historic record of the tireless work by the victim’s families and advocates in seeking truth and justice for their loved ones, and in advancing aviation security.

The generosity of so many touched so deeply by this tragedy has filled the Archive with the victim’s stories and provided for a limited time a Pan Am Flight 103 Archivist.

The Archivist is uniquely positioned through a combination of professional insight and personal interaction with the Pan Am Flight 103 community of families and friends to support the families, the Remembrance Scholars, and the University in their mission to always “Look Back and Act Forward” in honoring the lives and memories of the daughters, sons, spouses, friends, and in all cases, our loved ones.

Our Proposal

Syracuse University will continue to honor its original commitment to preserve the memory of our 35 students and to create a permanent and living memorial archive for all who perished in the Pan AM Flight 103 disaster. We propose the creation of an endowment for the Pan Am Flight 103 Archivist position to make this position a permanent part of the Pan Am Flight 103/Lockerbie Air Disaster

Archives. Endowing the Pan Am Flight 103 Archivist position ensures a personal and human connection to each victim’s story.

Our Goal

To raise \$1.5 million by the 30th anniversary of Pan Am 103 in October 2018 to permanently endow the Pan Am 103 Flight 103/ Lockerbie Air Disaster Archivist position.
